Performance highlights for the Quarter

QUARTER 1: Highlights of Vote Performance

- 1. Corporation Framework
- The mission met all its obligation to service providers and staff in payment of its dues in a timely and accurate manner such as salaries, allowances, rents and all utilities.
- The Mission was invited to attend a diplomatic university event that was organized by the Chandigarh University. The meeting was geared towards providing scholarships on online degrees to students in Uganda amidst the new normal of online classes after the pandemic.
- The Mission was required by the Ministry of Health (U) to do a due diligence on a company that was contracted to supply oxygen machines for all regional referral hospitals. The report on finding was submitted to the relevant ministry.
- The Mission carried out a due diligence exercise that was requested by REA and UEDCL on a company L&T for the distribution of electricity In the North pert of Uganda. This exercise was carried out over 3 days and the report submitted to respective government agency through the PS
- All staff appraisals were dully carried out for both home based and local staff
- All home-based staff were enrolled to physical fitness classes on a quarterly basis
- 2 staff facilitated in the first quarter to start their masters' classes
- 1 finance committee meeting held for the quarter
- 2 management committee meetings held for the quarter

Consular services

- Officials from the Mission Visited the Uganda community in Bangalore on issues of meeting with the authorities such as the police and FRRO regarding the mistreatment of Ugandans (Africans) in the state
- The Mission also visited the prisoners in the state of Karnataka including 4 students who are in prison for fraud but haven't yet been convicted for over 2 years now
- The Mission provided a report on this to the Ministry of Foreign affairs in Uganda and the parents of these students on a way forward
- The Mission issues 15 emergency travel documents in the period to stranded Ugandans who had either lost or expired passports and wanted to travel back home
- The Mission also issues 5 letters of No objection to the repatriation of Ugandans who has passed away in India
- The mission also issues discount letters to Ugandans who had come to india for treatment under the hospitals that have MOUs with the Mission to provide treatment at a discounted rate
- The mission also continued to register Ugandans coming to India through the launched online registration platform by the consular office

3. Investment trade and tourism diplomacy

- The Mission dispatched a team of 2 officers on a reconesense visit to Jaipur in preparation for the scheduled road show in the city. The team was tasked with speaking to potential investors to attend, hotel to host
- The Mission organized a hybrid road show in the city of Jaipur. This was geared at attracting investment, tourism, and interest into Uganda to the business community in the state of Jaipur This included hire of venues, sound, decoration, momentous, carry bags for participants, etc
- At the road show, the HOM prepared local Ugandan food at the last dinner for the delegates to showcase the different varieties of food that are available in Uganda. These were bought from New Delhi by the Mission and prepared solely by the HOM
- The Mission visited the Nagpur cotton research institute and held meetings and a tour of their campus with an aim of linking the institute with the cotton growing regions of Uganda as well as the Uganda Cotton Development Organization. Reports were written and sent to the UCDO for follow up and implementation
- The Mission organized a team to visit Nagpur in preparation for the delegation of Ugandan small businesspeople that was later scheduled to visit India in search of SME technologies that can be set up with Minimum capital requirements. The mission visited 3 machine manufacturing facilities in the city of Nagpur, Maharastra
- The Mission organized a hybrid road show in the city of Chennai. This was geared at attracting investment, tourism, and interest into Uganda to the business community in the state of Tamil Nadu. This included hire of venues, sound, decoration, momentous, carry bags for participants, etc
- At the road show, the HOM prepared local Ugandan food at the last dinner for the delegates to showcase the different varieties of food that are available in Uganda. These were bought from Chennai by the Mission and prepared solely by the HOM
- The Mission contracted a group of Ugandan diasporas including students to form an inhouse dance troupe for the upcoming road show in Jaipur and Chennai. The group was paid a standard rate per day and all costumes were purchased by the Mission
- The Mission printed promotional materials in form of banners, flyers, books, and coffee table books to be used during the road shows as a way of show casing Uganda
