iii. The Mission, working with UPDF Contingent, rescued 2 Ugandans (Joel Okech and Omaru Makombe) who had been trafficked to Somalia and paid for their tickets back home.

iv. Provided consular services to many Ugandans who lost their jobs due to COVID-19, including mediation with their respective employers to compensate them and cover their repatriation air- ticket costs.

v. Facilitated the repatriation of 196 Ugandans from Somalia; an Awareness Meeting with Ugandans working and living in Somalia, on the COVID-19, pandemic was also held.

vi. Held a sensitization Meeting with Ugandans who were, due to be repatriated back to Uganda, to brief them on observing COVID-19 SOPs guidelines.

vii. Engaged with relevant authorities in Somalia to allow AMISOM/UPDF Troop Rotation Exercise to take place during COVID-19 lockdown.

viii. In coordination with Uganda Contingent Commander, facilitated return of remains of a one Ugandan (the late. George Eirutu) who had died in Baidoa, Somalia.

ix. Two (2) cases of Ugandan Footballers, who had been playing with Somalia Football Clubs, were handled and facilitated for their travel back to Uganda, in liaison with their employers.
