- iv) Russia AFROCOM Business delegation (8th -13th November 2021)
- v) French Minister of Trade and Investment (October 2021)
- vi) UK trade envoy (15th 17th) Nov 2021

Promoted Ugandan's trade and investment opportunities at 8 trade and investment promotion events: the Dubai Expo 2020 including the launch of Uganda Airlines to Dubai; China International Import and Export Exhibition; Italy -Africa Conference; Dubai Global Business Forum; Indonesia International Trade expo; German-Uganda Investment Trade forum; Uganda Week in Nairobi on Tourism and Education promotion; and Uganda Tanzania Oil and Gas Expo in Dar es salaam.

### PROMOTIONAL OF REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY

- 1. With our active engagements at UN General Assembly, the UN Security Council adopted a resolution reauthorizing the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM) until 31 March 2022, ahead of a phased handover of responsibilities to Somalia's security forces early.
- 2. The UN security Council also adopted resolution 2612 extending the mandate of the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO) and welcomed the increased collaboration of the DRC authorities with MONUSCO and with States (Read Uganda) in the region and stressed the importance of coordination and information sharing, including with MONUSCO, in the context of ongoing military operations in eastern DRC.
