### Performance highlights for the Quarter

#### OUTCOME PERFORMANCE

- a) Quantity of cotton produced a total of 69,012 bales of cotton lint have so far been produced; representing an increase in cotton production of 36% compared to FY 2020/21. Cotton production was however affected by prolonged drought especially in November and December, 2021 which decimated yields. Un-favourable weather over the last two seasons also affected production of food crops. Since cotton is a seasonal crop, prioritization of food production resulted in less acreage planted to cotton thus low cotton production. Cotton contributed Sh. 87 billion to household incomes, US\$ 32 million in lint exports & Sh. 24 billion in cottonseed sales.
- b) Quality of cotton 91% of the total bales so far classed are in the top 3 grades compared to 84% in FY 2020/21.
- c) Quantity of cotton consumed locally a total of 4,336 bales of lint were procured and supplied to Fine Spinners (U) Ltd (3,000 bales) & Southern Range Nyanza (NYTIL) (1,336 bales) under the Government funded Revolving Lint Buffer Stock Fund.

#### PERFORMANCE AT OUTPUT LEVEL

#### 1. Provision of cotton planting seed:

A total of 2,037 Mt of planting seed were distributed in 72 cotton growing districts in Busoga, South Bukedi, North Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile, Bunyoro and Rwenzori Regions. Out of the 2,037 Mt, about 106 Mt of cotton planting seed were distributed to farmers in the 10 hard-to-reach districts, namely Amuria, Katakwi, Abim, Koboko, Karenga, Zombo, Adjumani, Moyo, Yumbe and Ntoroko. A further 365 Mt of cotton planting seed were distributed to members of the 350 women groups, 210 youth Groups, 120 PWDs & 250 elderly persons in the above regions. Preparations for processing cotton planting seed for the 2022/23 season commenced. Cottonseed processing machinery and equipment at Pajule, Pader and Kasese Stations were overhauled and serviced. With support from UGCEA, the following seed processing requirements were procured: 7,000 litres of seed dressing chemicals, 800,000 pieces of seed bags and assorted protective wear.

Processing of cotton planting seed for the FY 2022/23 planting season commenced. About 4,020 Mt of fuzzy cottonseed were delivered to Pader and Kasese Seed Processing Stations. Delinting, grading, treatment and packaging of the cotton planting seed was undertaken. By end of Q3, 2,974 Mt of seed had been produced.

#### 2. Seed multiplication:

About 6,550 seed growers including Prison Farms, were mobilized to undertake seed multiplication in segregated areas in Abim, Adjumani, Alebtong, Apac, Buyende, Dokolo, Hoima, Iganga, Kaberamaido, Kaliro, Kasese, Kitgum, Kween, Namutumba, Nebbi, Oyam, Pader, Rubirizi, Serere, Tororo, Zombo, Yumbe and Agago Districts. Over 500 training sessions were conducted by extension workers for the seed growers on crop establishment, pest control, fertilizer application, soil and water conservation, harvesting and post-harvest handling of cotton. About 57 Mt of Foundation and first-generation seed were distributed to seed growers for multiplication. In addition, inputs procured by UGCEA were distributed to the seed growers i.e. 386 Mt of fertilizers, 157 spray pumps (48 motorized sprayers, 72 knapsack sprayers & 37 ULV pumps), 50,000 one-acre units of pesticides & 4,975 litres of herbicides. Forty-one (41) Prison Farms with 4,560 acres participated in multiplication of cotton planting seed and were assisted to access production inputs and extension services. Seven ginners (MMP Agro, Bon Holdings, Twin Brothers, GADC, Nyakatonzi, CN Cotton & Lukhonge Cotton Co.) were identified to buy and gin seed crops. A total of 4,020 Mt of fuzzy cottonseed were produced in the seed multiplication areas.

#### 3. Farmer mobilization and sensitization:

The CDO and UGCEA extension teams mobilized Lead Farmers to establish 4,660 demonstration gardens in Busoga, South Bukedi, North Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile, Bunyoro & Rwenzori Regions. Over 14,000 training sessions were conducted by extension teams at the demonstration gardens and over 138,120 farmers were trained on cotton production technologies including 350 women groups, 210 youth Groups, 120 PWDs & 250 elderly persons. Seven extension messages on crop establishment, pest management, soil & water conservation and harvesting & post-harvest handling, cotton quality & destruction of stalks after harvesting were broadcast in 10 local languages using local radios. By end of Q3, 30,398 Mt of seed cotton (equivalent of 69,012 bales of lint) had been purchased from farmers.

#### 4. Provision of cotton inputs:

Under the Cotton Production Support Program, high quality cotton production inputs (fertilizers, herbicides, spray pumps and pesticides) are supplied to farmers at affordable prices. A total of 533,738 one-acre units of pesticides, 978 spray pumps, 450 Mt of fertilizers & 5,377 litres of herbicides were distributed to cotton farmers in the 72 cotton growing districts including 350 women groups, 210 youth Groups, 120 PWDs & 250 elderly persons. Out of this, 25,000 one-acre units of pesticides, 53 spray pumps, 140 Mt of fertilizers & 64 litres of herbicides were distributed to farmers in the 10 hard-to-reach districts. In addition, CDO received a donation of 30,000 litres of Deltamethrin, 6,000 litres of Malathion 45%, 6,000 litres of Malathion 96%, 8,000 litres of Chlorpyrifos & 480 ULVA sprayers from MAAIF for control of pest. Out of that, 1,720 litres of Deltamethrin, 540 litres of Malathion 45%, 1,962 litres of Chlorpyrifos & 374 ULVA sprayers were distributed to farmers. The low up-take of pesticides by farmers was attributed to late delivery of the pesticides & drought during November & December, 2021. Over 138,120 farmers including 350 women groups, 210 youth Groups, 120 PWDs & 250 elderly persons were trained on proper application of inputs, on-farm storage & environment protection. The emergency procurement of pesticides and spray pumps reached the Best Evaluated Bidder Notice stage.

### 5. Cotton-targeted extension services:

Over 563 Field Extension Workers (455 for UGCEA & 108 LG extension workers) were trained on cotton production and mechanisms for delivery of extension services to farmers. Out of the 455 UGCEA extension workers, 38 extension workers were deployed in the 10 hard-to-reach districts. Under the guidance of the CDO extension team, the UGCEA extension workers conducted over 14,000 training sessions at the demonstration gardens for over 138,120 farmers including 350 women groups, 210 youth Groups, 120 PWDs & 250 elderly persons. The farmers were trained on crop establishment, proper weeding, pest control, fertility management, soil & water conservation, harvesting & post-harvest handling of cotton. Assessment of performance of the UGCEA extension workers was conducted. Restructuring of the extension network in order to improve service delivery was recommended. Review of the training manual & farmers' production guide was in progress.

#### 6. Support to mechanization of land opening:

Under the Cotton Production Support Program, approx. 2,527 acres were ploughed by UGCEA tractors. In addition, a total of 110,150 acres were ploughed by oxen (51,232acres for cotton & 58,918 acres for other crops). Over 12,000 acres were ploughed by oxen for the 350 women and 210 youth Groups.

In preparation for the first rains of 2022, the 17 UGCEA tractors were repaired & serviced. About 45 acres were ploughed by end of Q3. Tractor ploughing was generally low due to frequent dry spells.

- a) Procurement of electrical equipment of the Mechanical workshop the electrical materials (electricity cables, sockets, switches, MK boxes, earthing wire, etc) & Fire Alarm & Detection System were delivered, installed, tested & commissioned for use.
- b) Procured & installed lighting and lightening protection.
- c) Procured & installed transformer switch gear.
- d) Procured & installed solar lighting system.
- e) Completed the procurement process for delinting & workshop machinery & tools (i.e. revolving centers, HSS tools, Parting tools, Grooving tools, Threading tools, Knurling tool, Dial stand & gauges, Center drills, drills, Slitting cutters, HSS hand tap sets, Die sets, HSS drills, Boring tools, Flat swin, temperature controllers, RTD sensors, Blower motors, Elevator motor, Pump tube) and opened a Letter Credit for the supplies. f) Hire a crane for transferring & installing machinery.
- g) Procurement of mechanical spare parts (inclined conveyor belt, brushes, drive belts, screen cylinders and block bearings) for the existing Delinting Machine was cancelled because the supplier refused to abide by PPDA regulations regarding payment schedules, performance guarantees, advance payment guarantee & CDO's desired place of delivery.
- 8. Project 1756 Retooling for Cotton Development Organisation (CDO)
- a) Renovation of the interior of Cotton House was completed.
- b) One Isuzu double cabin pick-up vehicle was procured & delivered.
