#### **QUARTER 3: Highlights of Vote Performance**

- 1.In February 2022, the Deputy Head of Mission held a Bilateral meeting with the State of Saxony in Germany on cooperation in the field of health and education.
- 2. The Mission facilitated the visits of His Royal Highness the Kabaka of Buganda.
- 3. The Mission undertook a consular visit to Poland, Slovakia and Hungary to assist stranded Ugandans fleeing the crisis in Ukraine from 14th to 22nd March 2022.
- 4.The Mission assisted Ms. Pamela Orobia, on 19th March 2022 a Ugandan national who was being detained in a camp in Czerwony border with ID number NR 0/69/2022 by providing for her a letter to enable her leave the camp and apply for a new passport for her and her child.
- 5.The Mission assisted Mr. Derrick Muhangi, on 15th March 2022 a fifth year student of engineering who had fled from Ukraine to Poland issued him a temporary letter to enable him travel to Germany for settlement.
- 6.The Mission met with Mr. Mukwaya, a Ugandan on 17th March 2022 who had fled from Ukraine and was staying in Bratislava with his Ukrainian wife and child. We conducted face-to-face interview and assisted him with application for a new passport to enable him apply for residence as he was married to a Ukraine national.
- 7.The Mission assisted 3 Ugandan students who left Kharkiv Ukraine and crossed over to Bucharest Romania. The students were Kevin Parsons, Beil Musinguzi Ian, and Shawn Ivor by issuing them letters to enable them cross into Germany.
- 8.On 21st March 2022, we held a meeting with 20 members of the Ugandan Community in Czech Republic. The Mission conducted face-to-face interview with those who wished to apply for new passports and we assisted them with the applications procedure.
- 9. The Mission visited Achelis Company and met with Joh. Achelis & Söhne GmbH in Bremen on 25th March 2022 to follow up on the joint vbenture between the company and the Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries to supply equipment.
- 10. The Mission held a meeting with over 30 students in Debrecen, Hungary and interfaced with the University on 18th March 2022. The Government of Hungary is giving Uganda 35 scholarships in 2023.
- 11. The Mission also held a meeting with the Honorary Consul of Uganda to Hamburg to seek out scholarships and partnerships in medicine and surgical training.
- 12. The Mission held a meeting on 18th March 2022 with 25 members of the Ugandan community in Budapest. The meeting discussed a number of issues affecting the diaspora and on Ugandans who had fled from the Ukraine due to the ongoing crisis.
- 13.On 15th March, the Mission held a meeting the Ugandan community in Poland. The meeting discussed a number of issues affecting the diaspora and on Ugandans who had fled from the Ukraine due to the ongoing crisis.
