Matters to note in budget execution

1. Recurrent: Wage

Only 2.7% (UGX 1.949Bn) of the released recurrent wage bill (UGX 71.105Bn) was unspent by close of the fourth quarter (Q4) of FY 2021/22. UNRA did not absorb 100% of the releases because of a number of staff exists that occurred within the FY. UNRA is also in process of recruiting staff after receiving clearance from Public Service.

2. Recurrent: Non-Wage.

1.7% (UGX 0.796Bn) of the released recurrent non-wage budget (UGX 47.499Bn) was unspent by close of the fourth quarter (Q4) of FY 2021/22.

The inability to absorb 100% of the releases is mainly attributable to the UGX 521,500,491 under employer contribution to the Social Security and Retirement Benefits Scheme contribution. This is wage related expenditure and therefore the increased staff exits and delay to receive clearance from Public Service to recruit directly affected the absorption of the released funds.

3. Development Budget

UNRA was appropriated a total of UGX 3,214.870 billion for development of the National Road network, with financing from the Government of Uganda (GoU) consolidated fund in the amount of UGX 1,719.399 billion inclusive of UGX 15.020 billion for domestic arrears under the Development budget and External Financing in the amount of UGX 1,495.471 billion for projects directly supported by the Development Partners.

3.1 Performance of Development - GoU Financed Budget

0.4% (UGX 5.641Bn) of the released GoU Development budget (1,286.572Bn) was unspent by the close of the fourth quarter (Q4) of FY 2021/22. Note that the released budget represents 75.7% of the appropriated Budget released (UGX 412.655Bn of the approved budget was not released by Ministry of Finance).

The inability to absorb 100% of the released funds is attributed to some bounced payments that were made towards end of the FY. These could not be re-effected as the payment system had closed.

Arrears Position by end of the FY 2021/22

UNRA closed the FY 2021/22 with total arrears amounting to UGX 528.502Bn including UGX 89.574Bn under Road Maintenance.

The arrears position has increased by 145.75% from UGX 215.059Bn at end of FY 2020/21 to UGX 528.502Bn at end of FY 2021/22. This is largely attributed to the budget suppression as observed above that is only 76.7% of the approved GoU budget was released.

It should be noted that the arrears shall directly affect the planned budget and progress of works for FY 2022/23 as they take the fast call on the budget. In addition, Government is expected to pay interest for delayed payments as per contractual obligations.

3.3 Performance of Development - Externally Financed Budget

67.3% (1,006.199Bn) of the released Development External budget amounting to UGX 1,495.471Bn was spent by end of the fourth quarter. The cash limit amounting to UGX 1,495.471Bn represents 100% of the approved annual External Financing budget released. The slow absorption is as a result of;

- As indicated above, UNRA did not receive 100% of the GoU approved budget and hence, several projects including Lot 1-Rwenkunye Apac (90.9km), Lot2: Lira Puranga (100.1km), Upgrading Rukungiri-Kihihi-Ishasha/Kanungu Road and Critical oil Roads were affected by delays in acquisition of the Right of Way which has directly affected the progress of works.
- Some of the projects including tourism roads and Refugee roads that is Moyo-Yumbe and Yumbe- Yure are still in procurement.

Noted that: due to delays resulting from Covid 19 among others, the following projects had works spill over into this financial year FY 2021-22, despite those outputs not having been planned at the budgeting stage (refer to table V2.2). The reasons for the spill overs are explained below; 1) Design Masaka-Bukakata road: Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to the revision of completion date to 30th August 2021 hence

- the extension of works into the new FY which had not been anticipated during budget preparation.

 2) Design Nyendo Sembabule (48km): Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to some outstanding works/ snags on Mpigi Town Roads
- (20km) to be done during DLP in FY 2021/22 and this was not anticipated at budget preparation.

 3) Mubende-Kakumiro-Kagadi Road: Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to the Additional Town roads (9.4km) being substantially completed on 7 July 2021 in FY 2021/22 and this was not anticipated at budget preparation.
- 4) Upgrading Mbale-Bubulo-Lwakhakha Road: There were outstanding works/snag works done during DLP which ended on 20 February 2022.
- 5) Namunsi-Sironko/Muyembe-Kapchorwa Section II: Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to the revision of completion date from 06th May 2021 to 24 October 2021 in FY 2021/22 which had not been anticipated during budget preparation.
- 6) Hima-Katunguru Road: Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to some outstanding works/ snags on Hima-Katunguru Road and works for Kasese Town Roads (4.5Km) and Hima service roads (1.5Km) to be done during DLP in FY 2021/22 and this was not anticipated at budget preparation.
- 7) Ishaka-Rugazi-Katunguru Road: Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to some outstanding works/ snags on Ishaka-Rugazi-Katunguru Road to be done during DLP in FY 2021/22 and this was not anticipated at budget preparation.
- 8) Nakalama-Tirinyi-Mbale Road: Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to some outstanding works/ snags on Nakalama-Tirinyi-Mbale Road to be done during DLP in FY 2021/22 and this was not anticipated at budget preparation.
- 9) Rehabilitation of Masaka Town Roads (7.3 km): Delays as a result of Covid 19 among others led to the revision of completion date from 30th June 2021 to 17th December 2021 in FY 2021/22 which had not been anticipated during budget preparation.

Lot 1 - Tororo - Mbale - Soroti (150.8 km): Critical safeguard instruments were recently approved by the World Bank and of Capital work these include the Road ESIA. The Road ESIA, cleared by the Bank, was submitted to NEMA for review and approval on 4 March 2022. We are still waiting for NEMA approval. The quarry ESIA and RAP were submitted to the World Bank for review and approval. Comments were received from the Bank and the Contractor has addressed them. The revised documents are being reviewed by the Project Management, Monitoring Consultant and UNRA before resubmitting to Bank on 22 July 2022.

These include the Road ESIA, Ngetta quarry and Construction Environmental Social and safety management Plan (C-ESMP). The Abbreviated Resettlement Action (RAP) was prepared and submitted to the Bank. The assessment established that over 80% of the road section is encumbered. The Contractor was instructed to commence the rehabilitation and improvement works and the effective date is 1st July 2022.

Routine maintenance has been ongoing and the section Lot 2A (Soroti – Dokolo – Lira section) is in a fair condition.

Lot2B (Lira-Kamdini section) which was in bad condition, has been receiving heavy maintenance repairs since 22 April 2022 following the approval of the Social safeguards documents. Over 50% of the Lira-Kamdini section is now in a fair condition.

Ground breaking ceremony for reconstruction works for Lira – Kamdini section was carried out on 22 April 2022.
