### **QUARTER 4: Highlights of Vote Performance**

#### 1. Climate variability

During the reporting period, there was severe drought which affected agricultural research interventions such as demonstrations, on-farm trials and seed multiplication sites. Evaluation of research performance was affected as these interventions must be repeated to collect more data. Irrigation facilities should be provided for sustainability.

#### 2. Enabling laws

The biosafety bill has not been passed by parliament. Under the bill, agricultural would take advantage of technologies related to genetic engineering aimed for higher agricultural productivity. Scientists have trained in genetic engineering skills and eager to apply them given the current food situation in Uganda.

3. Inadequate financing of agricultural research

Over the last decade, agricultural research has been and still funded under project mode yet research requires stable funding regime to enable uninterrupted research process. We therefore recommend a deliberate effort by government to put in place a sustainable research fund to enable timely delivery of research products and services for food and nutritional security.

4. Transport equipment

Budget execution during the reporting period was affected by inadequate and inefficient transport equipment which is above the recommended mileage of 250,000 kilometers or five years. NARO has consistently suffered the prohibition on purchase of vehicles for the last six years which has affected the mobility of scientists to conduct research, hence reducing performance. A special government intervention is required for improved performance.

#### Performance highlights for the Quarter

NARO undertook a study on the impact of NARO improved agricultural technologies on livelihoods of farmers. The study revealed that 79% and 60% of farmers were using improved NARO maize and beans varieties, respectively. Beans and maize were reported to contributed 48% (Ugx 2.08M) and 36% (Ugx 1.65M) of the total household incomes. The results further revealed that households that adopt NARO technologies are 76% food secure compared to the non-adopters (63%). Beans and maize contributed 43 and 53% female and male energy intake respectively. The estimated national benefits of adopting improved maize technologies were USD 22M, 45 and 65 at adoption rates of 25%, 50% and 75% respectively. For beans, this stood at USD 4M, 8, and 13. The difference is largely due to larger areas under technology for maize technologies and a higher adoption rate.

The number of products and services was 15; 8 food/nutritional security and 7 for industry.

Fifty-three (53) Information, educational and communication materials to support technology development and transfer, were produced. These included manuals, publications and protocol.

Anti-tick vaccine product was cleared by National Drug Authority (NDA) for geographical trials. The NDA geographical trial certificate was secured for the anti-tick vaccine product and 5,000 trial doses were manufactured.

During the reporting two (2) out of five (5) new research laboratories were constructed. These were Aflasafe lab at 80% and; vaccine research and production facility at 70%.
