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Performance highlights for the Quarter

OUTCOMES: 115,975 bales (@ 185 Kg) of cotton produced in 2022/23 compared to 69,099 bales in 2021/22. 9,384 bales purchased for local value addition. 76% of cotton classed in top 3 grades.

OUTPUTS: 1) Planting seed - 1,834 Mt of delinted & graded seed were produced at Pajule & Kasese Stations for planting in 2023/24. 2) Seed multiplication - 3,504 Mt of certified fuzzy cotton seed were produced. 3) Farmer mobilization & sensitization - sensitization of farmers on post-harvest handling & marketing was done using local radios in local languages. Over 2,300 Lead Farmers in Busoga, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile & Mid-West & Central Regions were identified for planting demo gardens in 2023/24. 4) Cotton inputs – 1,200 spray pumps & 17,250 units of Dimethoate pesticide were delivered in May 2023. Contracts for Select plus & Eminent pesticides were signed; delivery expected in Sept. 2023. Procured 3,000 bales of lint for FSUL using buffer fund supplementary budget. 5) Extension services - 6 re-fresher trainings were conducted for 184 UGCEA Extension Workers in Busoga, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile and Mid-West & Central Regions. 6) Land opening - about 249 acres were ploughed under the CDO/UGCEA tractor hire scheme in Lango, Teso and West Nile Regions while 26,439 acres were ploughed by oxen in Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso and Lango Regions during the first rains of 2023. 7) Admin & support services – 35,000 bales of cotton lint were classed & issued quality certificates. 8) Retooling - 2 generators were installed at Pajule Station. Spare parts for ginnery machinery were delivered. Contract for supply of gravity grader was signed, delivery is expected in Sept, 2023. Contract for supply of switch gear was signed, delivered is expected in Oct, 2023. Safety signages & plate signs were installed at Pajule Station. Procurement process for limited external works at Pajule Station was cancelled due to the budget cut.

Variances and Challenges

- 1) The CDO budget was revised upwards because of the supplementary budget received specifically for transport rebate and procurement of lint for Fine Spinners (U) Ltd under the Government Revolving Lint Buffer Stock Fund.
- 2) The FY 2022/23 approved budget for Vote 155 was Sh. 17.233 billion out of which Sh. 16.820 billion was released. This resulted in a budget cut of Sh. 413 million.
- 3) Un-spent balances under the wage component arose due to death of a staff member while the over expenditure under development was due to the System paying withholding tax on a cancelled invoice.

Continue to mobilize farmers to cut cotton stalks after harvesting as a means of controlling pests. 3. In collaboration with the extension team, identify about 2,500 new lead farmers to host demonstration gardens during the 2023/24 planting season.

Expenditures incurred in the Quarter to deliver outputs

Monitoring of cotton marketing and ginning was done. A total of 51,084,024 Kg of seed cotton (equiv. to 115,975 bales of lint) were purchased from farmers. Farm-gate prices ranged between Sh. 2,000 to 2,500 per Kg of seed cotton.

Mobilization & sensitization of farmers on cutting stalks was done through farm visits and using local radios in local languages.

The CDO and UGCEA field extension teams identified over 2,300 Lead Farmers in Busoga, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile and Mid-West & Central Regions and sensitized them on preparations for planting demonstration gardens for the 2023 planting season.

Registration of Lead Farmers was slow because they were still involved in management and harvesting of first rains' food crops.

The contract for supply of Amdoc pesticide was differed to FY 2023/24 due to lack of funds.

Pesticides and spray pumps distribution guidelines were reviewed and shared with field extension staff to get their input.

The quantities of pesticides procured was affected by the budget cut while the timeliness of procurements was affected by inadequate quarterly releases and delays in opening Letters of Credit at BOU.

228004 Maintenance-Other Fixed Assets

Monitoring of ginning of seed crops from the seed multiplication areas and selection of high-quality fuzzy cottonseed for processing into planting seed for 2023/24 continued. The second consignment of 752 Mt of fuzzy seed were selected and delivered to Pajule and Kasese Seed Processing Stations.

A total of 1,834 Mt of delinted, graded and packed cotton planting seed were produced at Pajule and Kasese Stations for the 2023/24 cotton planting season. - 1) About 750 acres were ploughed under the tractor hire scheme in 1st half of 2022/23 in South Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, West Nile, Mid-West & Rwenzori Regions.
- 2) About 152,660 acres were ploughed by oxen in Busoga, Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile and Mid-West Regions. About 70,000 acres were ploughed for cotton and 82,660 acres were ploughed for other crops in the 1st half of FY 2022/23.
- 3) Out of the above, about 1,200 acres were ploughed in the 10 hard-toreach districts while 800 acres were ploughed for the women & youth groups.
- 4) Farmers in Busoga, Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile & Mid-West Regions were trained on ox ploughing & use of ox ploughs for weeding cotton.
- 5) About 249 acres were ploughed by tractor in Lango, Teso & West Nile Regions while 26,439 acres were ploughed by oxen in Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso & Lango Regions in 2nd half of 2022/23.

In total, 999 acres were ploughed by tractor while 179,099 acres were ploughed by oxen in 2022/23.
