In total, 2,341 pumps (CDO), 773,571 units of pesticides (167,445 units CDO, 140,613 units MAAIF, 465,513 units UGCEA) & 323 Mt fertilizer (UGCEA) distributed to farmers incl women & youth. 5) Extension services - 209 UGCEA & 180 LG Extensionists trained on cotton. 12 UGCEA Extensionists deployed in 10 hard-to-reach districts. 6) Land opening - 705 acres ploughed by tractor & 151,460 acres ploughed by oxen. 1,200 acres ploughed in 10 hard-to-reach districts & 800 acres ploughed for women & youth. 7) Admin & support services - 24 ginneries licensed. 19 ginners & 16 exporters registered. 60 Ginnery Seed Assistants trained. GOT tests done. FAQ standards supplied to ginneries. 75,116 bales of lint classed & issued quality certificates. Serviced 2 HVI lint testing machines. 8) Retooling - 2 generators delivered to Pajule. Contract for Switch Gear cleared by SG. LC for Gravity Grader submitted to BOU. Contract for spare parts signed. Procured insurance services for machinery. Procured 19 desk top computers, 9 laptops & 18 printers. Procured 3,000 bales of lint for FSUL using buffer stock supplementary budget.

Variances and Challenges

- 1) The difference between the approved budget and budget released was because CDO received a supplementary budget of Sh.9.5 billion for Fine Spinners (U) Ltd (FSUL) under the Revolving Lint Buffer Stock Fund.
- 2) Un spent balances under the non-wage budget component arose due to late submission of invoices by suppliers and postponement of monitoring of seed distribution because rains started in March, 2023 and farmers were focusing on food production.
- 3) Expenditures in excess of the original budget arose due to a supplementary budget released to CDO for procurement of lint for Fine Spinners (U) Ltd under the Government Revolving Lint Buffer Stock Fund. In addition, virements were made to meet additional funding requirements for insurance due to acquisition of new machinery & equipment and subscriptions to international bodies due to depreciation of exchange rate.
