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Performance highlights for the Quarter

- 1. Cotton planting seed 1,645 Mt of seed were distributed to farmers in Busoga, North & South Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, East & West Acholi, West Nile, Mid-West & Central & Kazinga Channel Regions. Of that, 119 Mt of seed were distributed to 10 hard to reach districts; Amuria, Katakwi, Abim, Napak, Kaabong, Adjumani, Moyo, Yumbe, Koboko & Obongi and 45 Mt were distributed to 350 women & 200 youth groups.
- 2. Seed multiplication 5,000 farmers & 41 Prison Farms participated in multiplication of cotton planting seed in Tororo, Kayunga, Kaliro, Kamuli, Iganga, Buyende, Mayuge, Jinja, Ngora, Kwen, Budaka, Katakwi, Serere, Amuria, Pallisa, Oyam, Amolator, Alebtong. Lira, Apac, Dokolo, Kaberamaido, Moyo, Adjumani, Nebbi, Yumbe, Abim, Pader, Kitgum, Kasese & Buliisa. Approx. 13,000 acres were planted.
- 3. Farmer mobilization 125,000 cotton farming households were mobilized to grow cotton in Eastern, Northern, West Nile, Bunyoro & Kazinga Channel Regions. 3,965 demonstration plots were established in 1,935 parishes & used to train farmers on cotton growing.
- 4. Cotton inputs 300,269 units of pesticides (287,619 units by UGCEA & 12,650 units by CDO) & 490 spray pumps from CDO were supplied to farmers incl. women & youth groups. Of that, 17,446 units were supplied to 10 hard to reach districts.
- 5. Extension services 196 Uganda Ginners & Cotton Exporters Association (UGCEA) Extension workers & 135 district Extension Officers & local leaders were trained on cotton production.
- 6. Mechanized land opening 249 acres were ploughed under the UGCEA tractor hire scheme in Bukedi, Lango, Teso & West Nile Regions while 26,439 acres were ploughed by oxen. About 450 acres were ploughed by oxen in 10 hard-to-reach and 300 acres were ploughed for 350 women & 200 youth groups.
- 7. Retooling Project specifications for walk ways, rain water harvesting system, burglar proofing for staff houses, CCTV system, Local Area Network (LAN) & water pumping firefighting system were developed.

Variances and Challenges

- 1. No funds were released for capital expenditure in Q1 of FY 2023/25.
- 2. Unspent balances under the wage component arose because the recruitment process was still on-going.
- 3. Unspent balances under the non wage recurrent budget were due to delayed submission of invoices by the service providers.

Ten Pre-season trainings were conducted for 196 Uganda Ginners Cotton Exporters Association (UGCEA) Extension workers in Busoga, South Bukedi, North Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, East Acholi, West Nile and Mid-West & Central and Kazinga Channel Regions.

Topics covered included farmer mobilization & group formation, land preparation & planting, crop management and soil & water Conservation.

The extension workers were deployed as follows: 21 in Busoga, 11 in South Bukedi, 8 in North Bukedi, 8 in Bugisu, 15 in Teso, 28 in Lango, 31 in East Acholi, 20 in West Nile, 20 in Kazinga Channel and 14 Mid-West & Central regions. Out of these, 9 UGCEA Extension workers were deployed in the 10 hard-to-reach districts of Amuria, Katakwi, Abim, Napak, Kaabong, Adjumani, Moyo, Yumbe, Koboko & Obongi.

Over 135 Local Government (LG) Extension Officers and Local Leaders in Amolatar, Pader, Nebbi, Busoga, Alebtong, Tororo, Gulu, Kitgum and Obongi Districts were sensitized on cotton production.

Fewer UGCEA extension workers were trained because UGCEA reduced the extension work force from 220 to 196 people due to budgetary constraints.

Only 9 UGCEA Extension workers were deployed in the 10 hard-to-reach districts because of the reduction in the total number of extension workers.

Fewer LG Extension Officers and local leaders were sensitized due to budget constraints.

3,965 one-acre demonstration plots were established in 1,935 parishes Busoga, Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, Acholi, West Nile, Mid-West & Central and Kazinga Channel Regions. Over 8,000 farmer training sessions were conducted at the demonstration plots covering planting, crop management, pest control and soil and water conservation.

Two extension messages on seed distribution and crop management were broadcast using local radios in 10 local languages.

Monitoring of crop establishment and management was done in the 10 cotton growing regions. An estimated 150,000 acres were planted to cotton. The crop was affected by frequent dry spells in July to September, 2023 in all regions

Establishing demonstration gardens was hampered by frequent dry spells experienced in Q1.

The number of farmers mobilized for cotton production and the number of parishes covered were lower than targeted due to inadequate funding coupled with frequent dry spells experience in July to September, 2023 which discouraged farmers from planting cotton.

17,250 units of Dimethoate, 23,000 sachets of Eminent and 28,750 units of Select plus which were procured in FY 2022/23 and delivered between June & August, 2023 were allocated and delivered to the 10 Regional Inputs Bulking Centers in Iganga, Tororo, Bukedea, Lira, Kitgum, Gulu, Pakwach, Nebbi, Kasese and Masindi. Input distribution guidelines were developed and Field Officers and Supervisors were appointed to oversee storage and distribution of the inputs in their areas of operation. By end of Q1, a total of 300,269 one-acre units of pesticides (287,619 units from UGCEA & 12,650 units from CDO) and 490 knapsack spray pumps from CDO had been supplied to farmers. Out of that, 17,446 units were supplied to farmers in the 10 hard to reach districts. Cotton farmers, including the 350 women & 200 youth groups, were trained on proper use of pesticides using the demonstration plots.

Timely procurement of pesticides was affected by insufficient release of funds for Q1.

Out of that, 1,645 Mt of seed were taken up by farmers in 75 cotton growing districts in Busoga, North & South Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, East & West Acholi, West Nile, Mid-West & Central and Kazinga Channel Regions.
Out of 1,645 Mt, 119 Mt of seed were distributed to the 10 hard to reach districts of Amuria, Katakwi, Abim, Napak, Kaabong, Adjumani, Moyo, Yumbe, Koboko & Obongi while about 45 Mt were distributed to the 350 women & 200 youth groups.

Seed distribution and crop establishment in Busoga, North & South Bukedi, Bugisu, Teso, Lango, East & West Acholi, West Nile, Mid-West & Central & Kazinga Channel Regions were monitored and it was established that frequent dry spells experienced between July and September affected seed uptake and planting.

Seed uptake by farmers was lower than targeted mainly due to frequent dry spells in July to September, 2023 which hindered planting.
