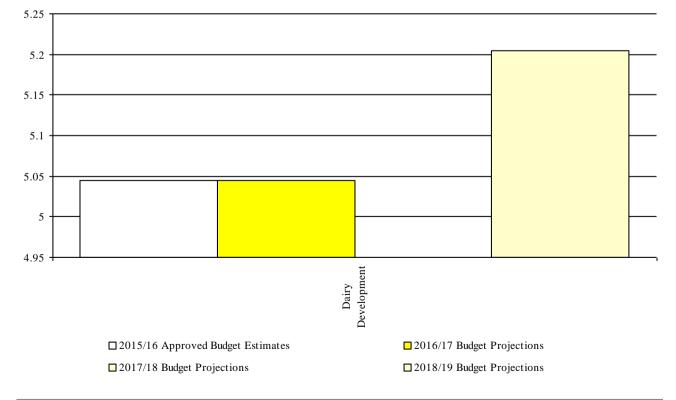

(i) Past and Future Planned Vote Outputs

2014/15 Performance

OUTPUT 0105502: PROMOTION OF DAIRY PRODUCTION AND MARKETING

In the FY 2014/15 a total of 2,340 farmers were trained in hygienic milk production and testing, hay making, group dynamics, Good Manufacturing Practices(GMPs) and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), dry season feeding, breeding technologies, yoghurt making and good dairy farming practices.

Fifty three (53) small scale processors were trained in business entrepreneurship and product development in Lyantonde, Teso Sub region and Entebbe Dairy School.

A total of 165 bags of Napier stems, 125 kgs of centrosema, and 300 kgs of chloris were procured for increased access to feeds and feed technologies.

Three hundred thirty (330) milk cans were procured and distributed to dairy farmers across the country;

Masindi milk collection centre was rehabilitated;

One dairy stakeholders meeting was held in Nakasongola to discuss the achievements, challenges and opportunities in the dairy sector.

The Authority participated in 4 agricultural shows; UMA, World Food Day in Kawanda; UVA Annual Symposium, organized a dairy event in partnership with UIA, Agri Pro Focus and SNV). Four (4) benchmarking visits (98 farmers: 79 male and 19 female) dairy cooperatives were undertaken in South western Uganda

Thirteen (13) milk parlors in South Western Uganda were designed.

OUTPUT 015503:QUALITY ASSURANCE AND REGULATION

A total of 1,608 dairy premises or equipment were inspected in 5 regions. The equipment includes coolers, freezers, consignments and road milk tankers

A total of 1,417 dairy premises were licensed and registered

A total of 2,142 milk and milk products' samples were analyzed;

Forty three (43) quality/safety feedback meetings were conducted; Seventy one (71) enforcement operations were carried out;

A total of 108 market surveillance activities were conducted;

A draft manual of HACCP analysis and plan was developed and presented and 2 staff bench marked in GMP, GLP, GHP and appropriate technology

Assorted lab equipment was procured.

Preliminary 2015/16 Performance The performance of Quarter 1 2015/16 is summarized as follows

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

The Authority's approved budget for FY 2015/16 is UGX 5.044 billion. By end of Quarter 1 a total of UGX 1.13 billion (22.4%) of budget had been released and UGX 0.877 billion (77.6%) of the release was spent.

PHYSICAL PROGRESS REPORT

Under the output of Promotion of dairy production and marketing, one key performance indicator of the two planned for was achieved above average due to better mobilization approaches supported by two functional regional offices in Mbarara and Soroti. A total of 1,428 dairy stakeholders were trained against the quarterly target of 683 which makes it 209%.

Under the Quality assurance and regulation output, the three key performance indicators were also above average. A total of 465 dairy premises/equipment/consignments were inspected against the target of 341. The dairy premises/equipment registered were 218 against the target of 250 and 784 samples of milk and milk products were analyzed in the National Laboratory against the target of 500 samples.

OUTPUT 015502: PROMOTION OF DAIRY PRODUCTION AND MARKETING

A total of 1,428 Stakeholders were trained in good dairy farming practices, hygienic milk production and testing, silage and hay making, group dynamics and breeding technologies ,dairy regulation and standards, cooperative strengthening and formation, milk quality assurance and control in Jinja, Luuka, Kamuli, Iganga, Amolatar, Kampala, Kitgum, Gulu, Apac, Amuria, Kumi, Soroti, Ngora, Kiruhura, Mbarara, Rakai, Ibanda, Jsingiro and the Entebbe Dairy Training School.

A total of 2,180 seedlings of calliandra were distributed in Ntungamo, Mbarara and Rukungiri

One collaborative meeting was convened with East Africa Dairy Development Project (EADD II) team to streamline collective activities of 10 Cooperatives namely; Kanyanya, Kyakabunga and Sanga DFCS in Kiruhura District, Nyamitsindo, Bukanga and Masha II DFCS in Isingiro District, Nyabuhikye, Ishongororo and Bisheshe DFCS in Ibanda District, Kitagwenda DFCS in KamwengeDistrict which will likewise be jointly operated as centres of excellence.

A National Dairy event was organized under the theme "Drink Milk for good health"; in partnership with Agri Pro Focus Uganda, at UMA show grounds.

(i) The Total Budget over the Medium Term

The total resource envelope for the FY 2016/17 is UGX 5.044 billion out of which UGX 1 billion is for the project "Dairy Market Access and Value Addition".

The FY 2017/18 has an MTEF allocation of 4.59 billion which indicates a reduction in allocation marking the end of the current 4 year project 1268- Dairy Market Access and Value Addition

(ii) The major expenditure allocations in the Vote for 2016/17

In the FY 2016/17, UGX 96 million has been allocated to training of dairy stakeholders along the dairy value chain, procurement and distribution of milk handling equipment, approximately 400 million has been allocated to the rehabilitation of Entebbe dairy training school and procurement of processing equipment. Inspection, registration and enforcement of dairy standards and quality will also be conducted will consume UGX 200 million.

(iii) The major planned changes in resource allocations within the Vote for 2016/17

The major changes in the allocation of resources include facilitation of the Board of Directors which was not budgeted for previously. So there is an increase in allowance budget line for the FY 2016/17 for the Board allowances.

Vote Summary

Under medical and agriculture supplies the authority had planned for National Dairy Quality Award. However for the FY 2016/17, this activity is unfunded.

Under consultancy services (short term) resources have been allocated to cater for accreditation of the National Dairy Analytical Laboratory and pending court cases.

Under capital purchase there is a reduction in the allocation of resources because in the FY 2015/16 the Authority had planned to rehabilitate two milk collection centres which will not be the case in the FY 2016/17.

The spending pressures of the Authority as indicated below total up to UGX 8.21 billion

BAN ON THE SALE OF LOOSE MILK

DDA's current MTEF does not cover fully the effective execution of the new policy; "the ban on the sale of loose milk" which was passed in the 3rd quarter of the FY 2014/15. Among others, the Authority will require mobile laboratories and the establishment of mini-laboratories at the regions. In the process of addressing issues of non-compliance, DDA will eventually achieve and maintain self-sufficiency in milk production, consumption and likewise increase dairy exports.

LAND TITLES

The Authority inherited several properties, in the Central, Northern, Eastern and Mid-western at the time of privatization. They included milk collection centres, a factory and residential buildings, all which were in a dilapidated state. This will require substantial funding to carry out surveys and acquire titles. Or else, the property is at risk of being encroached on.

ANIMAL NUTRITION AND BREEDS- "One heifer per household project"

The dairy industry is currently experiencing milk shortage largely because of inadequate improved breeds & poor animal nutrition. Nonetheless, the farmers' returns have improved because the demand for milk has gone up and hence increasing the farm gate prices. The growing processing capacity is the major reason the demand for milk is increasing. In order to continuously raise the incomes and standards of living of dairy farmers, there is need to improve animal nutrition through mechanization of pasture production and preservation and restocking of improved dairy breeds (one heifer per household project). This too requires substantive funding.

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

DDA as development agency will need to complete the ongoing capital investments such as; rehabilitation of the Entebbe dairy training school for purposes of value addition extension workers (certificate and diploma holders), and rehabilitation of the dilapidated milk collection infrastructure it inherited during privatization in the East, North and Mid-west Uganda to enhance market access and reduce post-harvest losses.

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ESTABLISH REGIONAL OFFICES

For the Authority to ensure consistent improvement in quality and safety of milk and dairy products, the need to have a country-wide presence is inevitable. This will only be possible by the establishment of two more regional offices in Lira for Northern Region and Hoima for Mid-western Region covering Kiryandongo, Masindi, Buliisa and Kasese. This is limited to inadequate resources.

INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING

The Authority requires adequate manpower in order to effectively execute its mandate. The human resource relative to the scope of work countrywide is wanting because of the insufficient wage for the existing staff and planned recruitment as per the approved organizational structure.
