VI. VOTE NARRATIVE

Vote Challenges

The ODPP faces the challenges of Inadequate financial and human resources Inadequate transport equipment as well as the changing technology and need to amend Article 120 of the Constitution Despite the DPP s mandate many priority areas have remained unfunded and underfunded as detailed below

RECRUITMENT There is a critical need for recruitment of Prosecutors to extend the scope of reach of criminal prosecution services As of 30th August 2021 the ODPP was not present in 45 districts and 101 courts There is a staffing gap of 537 Prosecutors In the FY2022/23 the ODPP requires additional funding worth UGX 32 713bn and UGX 28 041bn for wage and nonwage

TRANSPORT EQUIPMENT In order to strengthen criminal prosecution service delivery the ODPP established 16 Regional Offices and 142 Field Stations the ODPP requires UGX 28 800bn for the procurement of vehicles to support criminal prosecution services

COMPUTERIZATION There is need to embrace computerization to improve service delivery in case management amidst the COVID19 pandemic and the ODPP will require additional funding of UGX 3 650bn

FURNITURE AND FITTINGS The ODPP intends to purchase additional furniture for the existing and newly recruited staff This will require UGX 2 150bn

RENOVATION AND MAINTENANCE OF OFFICES The ODPP intends to renovate and maintain old office premises in 8 stations including Masaka Arua Mbale Mbarara Tororo Kasese Kitgum Apac This requires a total of UGX 1 6bn

LAND TITLING FOR 12 OFFICES The ODPP intends to process and secure land titles for its premises in Tororo Kasese Arua Masaka Mbale Rukungiri Ntungamo Kisoro Kiboga Mpigi Masindi and Mubende This will require a total of UGX 0 5bn

Overall the ODPP requests additional budgetary support of UGX 97 454bn for the FY 2022/23 to address the concerns highlighted above
