In terms of budget absorption, the development component of the budget didn't not perform well. This is attributed to the fact that the funds released there under were insufficient to deliver the planned outputs. Therefore, these funds are awaiting the second quarter release for accumulation.

The expenditure on the domestic arrears component also performed well, with Q1 budget absorption at 100%.

The performance challenges for the Quarter 2 include;

(i) All the remaining funds for Uganda's annual contribution to the EAC Secretariat need to be released and

remitted so that Uganda adheres to the directive of the EAC Council of Ministers. The decision requires that EAC Partner States make full annual contributions by December of each financial year.

- (ii) Since funds released in Q1 under the GoU Development component were insufficient for the planned outputs, there is need to realize adequate releases there under so that these procurements are made.
- (iii) In order to improve quality of budget report production, staff of planning units who are responsible for preparation of these budget reports need to have access to the IFMS. This will ease the extraction of financial outturn data for use in preparation of the reports. In addition, there is need to expedite the finalization of the online web based OBT and its interface with the IFMS so that importation and exportation of release and outturn financial data is improved.
