I. VOTE MISSION STATEMENT

To promote good governance through prevention of corruption, enforcement of the rule of law and citizen engagement.

II. STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE

The Strategic Objectives for the Inspectorate of Government (IG) are to:-

Foster active citizen participation in prevention of corruption and maladministration at all levels of governance

Strengthen mechanisms for prevention and detection of corruption in the public sector to the benefit of all Citizens across the various regions in Uganda.

Enhance mechanisms for investigation and prosecution of corruption.

Enhance enforcement of Leadership Code of Conduct.

Enhance compliance to laws, rules and regulations in public offices for improved service delivery to the different kinds of people, especially the most vulnerable groups such as the youth, women, PWDs and the elderly.

Strengthen IG institutional and organizational capacity to deliver on its mandate.

III. MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2025/26

In the current financial year, the IG has registered the following key achievements:

Received 1,516 complaints on corruption and maladministration in public offices raised by 187 females, 1090 males, 18 organizations and 221 anonymous sources.

Concluded 308 investigations of corruption cases in MDALGs across the country. As a result, UGX 314,312,852 was recommended for recovery, 108 administrative sanctions were issued to various public officers found culpable.

Prosecuted 8 corruption cases at the Anti Corruption Division of High Court, resulting into 2 convictions, 4 withdrawals, 1 acquittal, 1 dismissal.

Recovered UGX. 2,021,869,076 from illicitly acquired assets or wealth.

Resolved 330 ombudsman complaints in MDAs (65) and LGs (265). Resultantly, UGX. 844,122,884 was recommended to be paid to different persons who had complained to IG for non-payment of salaries, pensions, gratuity and other related benefits. In addition, citizens were supported to access birth certificates, letters of administration, passports, national identity cards and land titles from the government departments.

Concluded 7 system reviews, 8 systemic investigations, 3 compliance checks and reactivated grievance handling mechanisms in MDALGs. Arising from these interventions, recommendations were made for improvement of processes, systems and work methods in offices such as Office of the Prime Minister, Uganda Investment Authority, Uganda Medical and Dental Practitioners Council, Nyendo Mukungwe Town Council, Ministry of Local Government, Ministry of Trade, Industry and Cooperatives, Bundibugyo DLG, Kyenjojo DLG, Wanyange Girls Secondary School, Buganda Road Primary School, Nsamize Vocational Training Institute, Bukalasa Agricultural College and Nakawa Vocational Institute.

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Concluded 246 investigations into breaches of the Leadership Code of Conduct. Arising from the investigations, 68 cases were forwarded to the Leadership Code Tribunal for adjudication.

Conducted 58 on spot inspections in selected MDALGs to assess service delivery, accountability and compliance with laws and guidelines. Some of the institutions inspected included: Kalaki HC III in Kalaki DLG, Kumi HC IV Kumi Municipal Council, Wera Technical School, Amuria DLG, Ajeleik, Amaseniko and Kobuin Acowa Primary schools in Kapelebyong DLG, Buikwe Health Center III in Buikwe District, Kafo River Primary School in Nakasongola District, Nsanja Primary School in Mukono District, and Lolucole HC III in Agago DLG. Arising from the on spot inspections the following were observed: persistent delays in delivery of essential public services, inadequate supervision in implementation of government programs, Weak supervision of government employees, Absenteeism and late reporting to duty by some public officers and poor maintenance and management of government assets and equipment. The IG directed the responsible Accounting Officers and supervisors to reprimand officers found absent without authority and improve record management and compliance. The matters requiring further investigation were documented or referred for action

Enlisted the participation of young people in institutions of learning in the war to prevent corruption through the formation of Integrity Ambassador Clubs (IACs). IACs were established and launched at St. Marys College Kisubi and Eagles Nest SSS during which over 300 students were commissioned as ambassadors committed to honesty, accountability and transparency. The students were commended for promoting anti-corruption efforts at their neighbouring schools. In addition, the IG also initiated the idea of forming Integrity Ambassadors Clubs at Jinja College, Busoga High School, Kyebambe Girls, Kyabenda S.S, and Moroto High School to foster ethical leadership among students.

Reached out to the general public through the media to inform and educate them about the IG mandate, promote transparency and accountability, and strengthen public understanding of its roles and activities. In the reporting period, the public was engaged using the following media platforms: Fourteen (14) radio talks on Impact FM, Metro FM, Radio Sapientia and Kingdom, Nine (9) TV shows on NBS TV, UBC TV, Family TV, Spark TV, Salt TV and Dream TV, 6 media interviews with the following media houses: NBS TV, Daily Monitor, New Vision, Bukedde TV, Bukedde Newspaper, and UBC TV, Seven (7) press statements and one (1) press conference.

Conducted targeted boardroom sessions in MDALGs to mediate disputes and strengthen inter institutional partnerships, emphasizing accountability, restitution and program enhancements. A case in point was a session held with Jinja City leaders to address the stalled construction of Uganda Railway Seed Secondary School. It was established that the project had stalled due to misappropriation of funds. The implicated leaders were directed to refund misappropriated funds or face prosecution.

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VI. VOTE NARRATIVE

Vote Challenges

The IG continues to face a number of strategic and operational challenges that affect its ability to effectively deliver on its mandate of Anti Corruption, Ombudsman and Enforcement of the Leadership Code of Conduct. These include:

Inadequate Funding and Logistical Resources: Limited financial resources constrain the implementation of core activities such as verifications, investigations, prosecutions, and TAAC mainstreaming interventions, research and advocacy. The situation is compounded by an aging fleet of vehicles, and limited operational tools.

Human Resource Constraints: The IG continues to experience understaffing at both Headquarters and Regional Offices, coupled with limited specialized expertise required for complex investigations, asset recovery, and technical assessments. This has resulted in heavy workloads and delayed case resolution.

Low Responsiveness and Cooperation from MDALGs: Delays in obtaining information and feedback from MDALGs continue to slow down investigations and enforcement processes, undermining timely resolution of cases.

Emerging and Complex Corruption Trends: The increasing sophistication of syndicated and cross border corruption has exposed critical gaps in the Inspectorate of Government investigative capacity. These relate to lack of specialized equipment, limited digital forensics, financial analysis, and secure evidence management tools which constrain the IG ability to trace complex financial flows, secure admissible evidence, and support effective prosecutions.

Inadequate automation and integration of Government business processes: The IG continues to face a significant operational challenge because many MDALGs heavily rely on manual and partially digitized systems resulting in delays in detecting irregularities early, audit trails and obtaining relevant data for investigation. Addressing gaps in automation and system integration is therefore critical in strengthening internal controls to improve transparency and accountability in service delivery.

Inadequate Automation of IG operations: The IG still faces challenges occasioned by inadequate automation of its internal operations limiting the organizations ability to coordinate timely execution of tasks. A substantial investment is required in order to completely automate its business procedures.

Gaps in the legal framework: The IG ability to successfully investigate and prosecute corruption cases is hindered by gaps in the legal framework for recovering proceeds of crime and witness protection. This results in case backlogs, dismissed prosecutions, and minimal recoveries.

Plans to improve Vote Performance

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To enhance efficiency and effectiveness, the Inspectorate of Government will implement the following key performance improvement measures:

Strengthening Prosecution-Led Investigations and Legal Capacity: The IG will attach prosecutors to all investigation files from the outset, provide continuous legal training, enhance engagement with investigators on best practices, ensure access to legal research resources, and develop in-house guidelines to improve the effectiveness of investigations, prosecutions and asset recovery.

Strengthening Institutional Capacity and Staff Competence: The IG will continue to build staff capacity through targeted training, mentorship, benchmarking, and on-the-job coaching. Efforts will focus on enhancing technical skills in Anti Corruption, implementation of the Ombuds role and enforcement of the Leadership Code of Conduct. Recruitment of specialized experts and engagement of external professionals will also be pursued where in house capacity is limited.

Enhancing Collaboration and Partnerships: The IG will strengthen internal coordination across Directorates, Divisions, and Units, and foster external partnerships with other anti-corruption agencies, MDAs, CSOs, and development partners to promote synergy and shared impact in the fight against corruption, maladministration and the enforcement of Leadership Code of Conduct.

Leveraging ICT and Digital Tools: The IG will embrace the use of ICT in investigations, case management, and communication, including the use of digital media to increase public awareness and engagement on Anti Corruption efforts.

Improving Case Management and Service Delivery: The IG will ensure effective prioritization of cases, adherence to investigation timelines, and timely feedback to complainants. Teamwork, and regular supervision will be emphasized to improve case quality and reduce backlog.

Strengthening TAAC Mainstreaming and Resource Mobilization: The IG will mobilize resources to support the implementation of the strategic plan and the TAAC action plan, deploy more technical staff to handle the growing workload, and establish a task force to coordinate TAAC mainstreaming and related activities.
