Performance highlights for the Quarter

The Commission placed 3 Recruitment adverts for the declared vacant positions for Principal Judge (1), Chief Registrar (1), Registrar (3), Deputy Registrar (2), Chief Magistrate (1), and Magistrate Grade I (1); and 59 positions of administrative and other staff of judiciary service.

The Disciplinary Committee held six (6) Sittings where 41 complaints were handled out of which 17 were against Judicial Officers and 24 against Other staff of the Judiciary service.

During Q4 FY 2024/2025, 34 complaints against Judicial; and administrative and others staff were fully investigated. The Commission also held One (1) Mobile complaints handling & investigations in Fort Portal City where a total of 1,790 clients were attended too, of which 226 clients at the venue and 1564 in prison.

The Commission conducted Court Compliance Checks in 08 Magisterial Areas of Luwero, Nakasongola, Kayunga, Buikwe, Kyenjojo, Kibaale, Dokolo, Kaberamaido and 04 High Court Circuit of Kiboga, Jinja, Iganga and Luwero. In addition, One(1) Anti-Corruption Baraza in Kamuli; Four (4) radio talk shows in Kasese, Fortportal, Kiboga, and Buliisa; and One (1) Anti-corruption workshop (sensitize local government duty bearers) in Arua district on processes for facilitating a corruption free judiciary were conducted.

The commission undertook 2 Media engagements; 1 Prison in-mates sensitizations on prisoners' rights and trial procedure and JSC mandate in Ngogwe Prison in Buikwe District; 2 live Television shows, 20 radio talk shows, 15 court users engagements; 5 engagements with other staff of the Judiciary; 5 engagements with judicial officers; 5 School sensitizations; and engagements with members of 10 Local Council Courts.

The Commission was able to purchase 2 vehicles, 3 Laptops, 3 Printers, 2 Desktop Computers with UPS, One (1) Digital Camera, Two(2) Heavy Duty Scanners, 9 filing Cabins, our (4) Television sets, 40 Telephone Handsets, and assorted furniture.

Variances and Challenges

- 1. The Commission still faces transport challenges that affects timely activity implementation. The Commission's fleet is also past the recommended mileage and age which makes it expensive to maintain.
- 2. The Commission also faces challenge of office equipment. There has been low release of funds under retooling project over the years which has limited the Commission to retool and provide appropriate office equipment to it's staff.
- 3. The Commission had a staffing gap majorly under the critical departments. This over works the lean staff and therefore affect delivery.
- 4. The Commission is not yet fully automated which affects its service delivery to the public. There is a need to fully automate all the business processes for the commission to increase efficiency and effectiveness.
