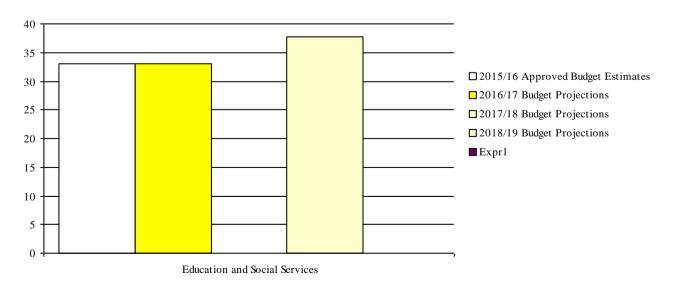

#### (i) Past and Future Planned Vote Outputs

2014/15 Performance

School Infrastructure and School Ambiance

The following projects were completed: renovation of a 7 classroom block at Kasubi Church of Uganda PS in Lubaga Division; Construction of a kitchen and renovation of Namungoona Kigobe PS in Lubaga; construction of staff Quarters at Naguru Katali PS in Nakawa Division; renovation of staff quarters at Ntinda PS in Nakawa; construction of a perimeter fence at St James Biina PS in Nakawa; construction of chain link fence at Ntinda PS in Nakawa; renovation of a classroom block at Kansanga PS in Makindye; construction of a Kitchen and a store at Nateete Mackay PS in Rubaga and rehabilitation of the first 2 units of staff quarters at St Mbaga Tuzinde in Nakawa; 10 classroom block re-roofed at Kitebi P/S using a donation of iron sheets and labour from Hajji Ssebufu Mohammed and 2 classrooms, a staff house was renovated at the Spastics School and 7 classrooms at Muslim Girls and 3 classrooms at Namungoona orthodox P/S were painted

Several infrastructures have been provided with support from other partners. These include; Construction of 22 classrooms at Kampala High School with assistance from ADB; Construction of the 1st floor of a classroom block at Queen of Peace PS was completed from internally generated funds and parents' contributions; Construction of 9 classrooms in KCC Kamwokya PS was completed with support from Mondetta in partnership with KCCA; renovation of a school Kitchen and construction of energy saving stoves by GVEP at Mirembe PS in Makindye and the assembly ground at Nateete Mackay PS was levelled and tarmacked with assistance from the Verkey Gems Foundation. Meanwhile Bukasa Primary school nursery section was completed, funded from Corporate Social Responsibility contribution of KCCA Management.

### **Vote Summary**

Two schools have infrastructure construction ongoing; 6 teachers' houses at Queen of peace P/S, works are 40% complete and Construction of a Nursery School Classroom at Makarere COU P/S is at beam level.

Ambiance was improved in 25 Government aided primary schools with support from the private sector. The beneficiary schools include; Kasubi CU PS, Nakivubo Blue PS, Kibuye PS, St Peters Nsambya PS, Luzira CU, St James Biina, and Police Children PS, Muslim Girls P/S, Nateete Muslim P/S, Namungoona Orthodox P/S, Naguru Katali P/S, Mpererwe P/S, St Martin Mulago P/S, Kisaasi P/S, Ttula P/S, Kawempe Muslim P/S, Kisugu C/U PS, Luzira CU PS in Nakawa and Makerere CU P/S. Ambiance improvement includes; painting, window pane replacement and other minor repairs.

Other school ambiance improvement works executed are compound improvement and paving of walkways in 5 schools: Nagulu Katali PS, St Lawrence Kigoowa PS, Luzira CU in Nakawa and Namirembe infants PS, Nateete Mackay PS in Rubaga

Tree planting and beautification was done in 3 schools (St James Bbiina P/S, Kiswa P/S, Kyanja P/S) 5 schools were identified for development of tree Nurseries in partnership with Green Effort Foundation they include; Kisaasi P/S, Namungoona Kigobe P/S, Kansanga P/S, Kamwokya P/S, St. Mbaga Tuzinde P/S.

A meeting was held with LVEMP II Team to forge a partnership which will lead to the setting up of a money generating project for the school. Meanwhile an initial discussion with MTN Uganda to explore the possibility of securing computers for government grant aided schools was organized.

School Sanitation

The following Sanitation Infrastructure were Constructed with partners in development:

24 toilet stances were constructed as follows; 8 stance water borne toilet at St Paul Nsambya P/S by pastors of Watoto; 8 stance water borne toilet at Kiswa P/S from Water Aid/ AEE; 8 stance water borne toilet renovated at Buganda Road P/S and 2 water tanks were donated to Namugoona Kigobe P/S and Kisaasi p/S by Crestank and a VIP latrines and water tanks in 22 schools (government and Private) funded by EU through AMREF were commissioned.

8 stance VIP latrines at Kasubi CU PS and Kasubi Family PS in Rubaga Division, Kawempe Muslim PS, Kisaasi PS and Kawempe CU PS in Kawempe, in partnership with African Envangelistic Enterprise (AEE); Construction of a VIP latrine at Kitebi PS with assistance from InterAid.

Another 11 eight stance water borne toilets were constructed in 10 government grant aided primary schools with funding from African Evangelistic Enterprise in partnership with KCCA. The beneficiary schools include; Kitante P/S, Nakasero P/S, kamwokya P/S, Nakivubo Blue P/S, Old Kampala P/S, Kiswa P/S, Mbuya CU P/S, Namirembe Infants P/S, Mengo P/S, St Mbaga Tuzinde P/S and Kyanja Muslim P/S. 8 stance VIP latrines and 6 stance VIP latrine were constructed at St Mbaga Tuzinde and Kyanja Muslim PS in Nakawa respectively; meanwhile construction of VIP is still in progress at St Paul Ggaba PS in Makindye , Kalinabiri PS in Nakawa, St Pauls Kyebando PS & Makerere CU P/S in Kawempe.

#### School Furniture

225 desks were supplied to Kamwokya P/S as part of GOU funding, 16 Special Needs Desks were donated to Spastics P/S as a donation from partners and 50 desks were procured for Kansanga P/S from locally

generated funds.

#### School Land

The following has been achieved in an effort to secure land for primary schools in the city. The achievements are; KCCA was offered a 99 year Lease from Buganda Land Board for Plots 1-3 and 1-7 Kansanga Nabutiti on a 13 acre piece of land housing Kansanga PS and Kansanga Seed SS; and the complainant who threatened to demolish three classroom blocks of Railway Children PS was engaged and a proposal of co-existence with sections of the school buildings.

Processes to secure school land is on going for the following schools; Kalinabiri P/S, Bukasa P/S, Kawempe Muslim, Mirembe P/S, P/S Kitebi P/S, Busega P/S and Katwe P/S. Two titled plots which were discovered leased out to private developers at Busega P/S are to be cancelled. And a re-survey for Kitebi and Katwe was agreed upon.

#### Human Resource Development

The Teachers Cooperative Society now has a registered membership of 1007 Teachers. Office space was provided for the cooperative society at City Hall and a manager identified and a request for the seed grant of 700,000/= was presented to Management.

181 Primary School Teachers were transferred within the Government aided Primary Schools in the City, hence reducing the challenge of staffing gaps in the schools.

2 training workshops were carried out, facilitated by the Directorate of Education Standards, Ministry of Education and Sports to build the capacity of the Education staff in conducting Monitoring of Learning achievements (MLA) inspection model.

And 79 Head Teachers of government grant aided primary schools were trained on innovations for attitude change under the sponsorship of STIR Uganda. Meanwhile 30 Head Teachers, Chairpersons of School Management Committee and Sanitation Teachers from 10 schools were oriented on good sanitation and hygiene practices and 12 Teachers from four government grant aided primary schools were trained in inclusive Education all with assistance from African Evangelistic Enterprise.

Teachers from 10 government grant aided primary schools were trained in special needs education with assistance from CHESHIRE Services Uganda.

500 Head Teachers and Proprietors of private schools were sensitized on tax obligations and 522 Head Teachers of both government grant aided schools and private schools were sensitized on Education Policy during beginning of term meetings. Meanwhile 4 radio talk shows to sensitize the public on policy guidelines relating to compliance of private schools were organized.

#### School Information Communication and Technology

30 laptops were donated to 10 government aided primary schools with the partnership of School Africa Foundation, the package included associated software for improving school governance and another 33 Computers were provided to Police Children PS(8) in Makindye Division and Nakivubo PS (25)and 5 Laptops to Luzira CU in Nakawa with support from a private partner.

315 Teachers were trained in PLE e-registration and 80 teachers were trained in basic ICT skills with focus on the schools online program by British council.

#### Library Services

Library served 5,754 patrons in the last three quarters. Of these 4,267 were males compared to the 1,457 females. More than 1,229 patrons used the ICT facilities and more than 1,120 books were utilized. Meanwhile 657 patrons have visited and used the Rubaga Library which was officially opened. The children's Library served 946 children only who participated in various literacy eliciting activities such as Read Aloud, Spelling Bee, Guided Reading, Silent Reading, Drawing/Coloring, Story Telling, Movie Watching, Movie, etc.

Partnered with the Kawempe Youth Centre and held a reading tent which was attended by 188 children from 16 schools from Kawempe Division. Meanwhile Namuwongo community library was opened in March 2015 by a Canadian lady (Megan). Her desire is for KCCA to take up responsibility of this library after three years

Assisted Research Students in their study about Kampala Library and Information Centre, its practices, operations, and Public health issues. Also received 4 Interns from Mukono and Mekerere Universities who were exposed to library Processes, procedures and best practices in order for them to gain some experience.

Trained 39 head teachers or representatives from Makindye and Kawempe Division on the UNEB online registration and one staff completed the training in ICT for Public Librarians at the Maendeleo Foundation.

Celebrated the Dear day in schools and at KCCA. This was intended to raise awareness about the importance of reading and participated in the organisation of the 3rd Literacy conference organised by Reading Association of Uganda and National Book Trust of Uganda

Participated in several events and meetings including: the teachers' forum organized by the British council in; the workshop by Uganda Textbook –Academic and Non-fiction Writers; one week workshop for systems librarians organized and a two months training course in Modern Library Practices and Management from the National Institute of technical teacher training and research in Chennai India

Developed two proposals – one on Internet Facilitation and another on One Book One Community to create awareness about reading.

Automation of the Library catalogue resumed, training of staff is taking place and tagging of the book is in process. Meanwhile, the stock taking exercise and weeding of library materials is taking place and continued to capture bibliographic details of books in Online Library System supported by Koha

Received 6 books from Public Health and 10 books from the Administrator Generals Office to help disseminate information to the Public; and received 23 computers to be given to primary schools.

Completed with data input and barcoding of all the library books in Online Library System supported by Koha and also completed the stock taking exercise and weeding of library materials.

Inspected 94 PLE centres to assess readiness for 2014 PLE and coordinated the correction of PLE draft registers from UNEB PLE centres, Meanwhile 274 PLE supervisors, 1130 PLE invigilators and 29 distributors were identified and selected.

A total of 27,925 candidates sat from 351 UNEB registered centre schools for the Primary Leaving Examinations. 30% of the candidates passed in Division 1, 52% in Division 2, 9.3% in Division 3, 5.4 % on

Division 4, 3.2% in Division U and 1.9% in Division X.

Registered 28571 candidates for 2015 PLE examinations out of whom, 9380 were UPE candidates and 19191 candidates were non UPE candidates. Meanwhile 36 candidates for UCE and 22 candidates for UACE were registered at the KCCA Lugogo UNEB centre.

Administered the Monitoring of Learning Achievement (MLA) Tests in 78 government grant aided primary schools to determine levels of children in Numeracy and Literacy in government grant aided schools.

1,729 institutions (429 Nursery Schools, 1,103 Primary Schools, 115 Secondary Schools and 10 Vocational Institutes) were inspected and provided with support supervision. Some inspections revealed that on average, 85% of the Girls attended school while average attendance for boys was at 87%. Some schools were recommended for UNEB centre numbers and 17 were closed for non-compliance.

Monitored staff establishment in primary, secondary and Tertiary Institutions and there were 1444 primary school teachers, 1415 secondary school teacher and 346 Tertiary Instructors. Meanwhile school enrolment was monitored and the enrolment of pupils in 80 government grant aided primary schools was at 68,937 pupils by end of year.

The average attendance for primary school pupils was 87% while average attendance for secondary school students was at 88% by end of year.

Monitoring of Learner Achievement Inspection findings were disseminated to school Management committees, Head Teachers and Deputy Head Teachers of 80 primary schools.

50 schools participated in the 2014 primary schools MDD festival a 103 children represented KCCA at the National Primary Schools Ball games Competition. The girls under 14 football team emerged champions in the category, meanwhile 54 pupils represented KCCA at the National Primary Schools Athletics meet in Lira.

Conducted Zonal Athletics Competitions in all the 5 Divisions in preparation for Division Competitions

#### Tourism

Prepared and presented the strategic actions for five years and budget for next financial year.

Update and promoted the tourism web portal on social media and other events and the site has now attracted nine million seventy nine thousand five hundred fifty (9,079,550) hits since its hosting.

Represented KCCA in Martyrs Day celebrations 2015 preparation where KCCA emptied all the toilets of both the catholic and protestant shrines, provided Garbage skips for the events and planned and participated in the Martyr's day walk that attracted pilgrims that walked the trail from Entebbe to Kampala

Received a consignment of 2800 postcards for Kampala principle attractions to promote Kampala and coordinated the designing of Kampala Visitor Map.

Over twenty hotel owners and managers hotels in Kampala were sensitized on standards requirement in preparation of IAAF championship games and held a three day sensitization workshop supported by Uganda Tourism Association where 40 Tour Operators were sensitized on the actions the authority is taking

to make Kampala a destination of choice.

Concluded the signing of the MOU for Kampala Sightseeing Bus Project with the preferred service provider, and undertook field assessment and finalized the process of allocating of spaces for the Tourist Information Booths to support the tourist Bus Services.

With other stakeholders, organized the celebrations of World Cultural Day at UNCC offices.

Completed plans to Construct Archbishop Janan Luwum Monument and leisure park at St. John Church of Uganda, Makerere.

Coordinated the recording and filming of a television programme "Uganda Ekula" on Bukedde to promote tourism in the city and supported the planning of the screening of Miss Tourism Buganda and coordinated permits for the promotion of the event.

Developed and presented the draft guidelines and strategy for offsite tours and tourism clubs in schools

Developed a concept for cultural festival to compliment Kampala events and nature talent and initiated and coordinated the development of the totem concept for (Royal Mile Tourism Development Concept) presentation to Buganda Kingdom. An impression for the fifty three totems and back ground research has been done for the road and impressions for the roundabout completed.

Developed a "Tour your City" Itinerary for the domestic market to be used to attract tourist for the country side and a meeting with UTB was held on ways of marketing Kampala to the country side.

30 CDD groups specializing in crafts were trained in quality assurance in the products, pricing, target marketing, craft design and branding.

Prepared a concept for the proposed International Beach soccer that was presented to management for approval and generated and published three articles of tourist information in the Uganda National Cultural Center sponsored events guide.

Developed and submitted a concept for the establishment of the Colonial Museum at Old Kampala. This partnership is supported by Buganda Kingdom who manage the fort, developed the concept and coordinated the development of impressions for the Nantawentwa junction and the draft plan and ideas for Kabaka's Lake Project was completed and handed over to the Katikiro of Buganda Kingdom.

KCCA attended the Expo at the Uganda Museum from 14th – 16th November, 2014, where KCCA was awarded with a certificate for her participation and the Minister of Tourism, Wildlife and Antiquities appreciated KCCA partnership in the organization of the Expo and ATA conference.

Participated in several events with view of promoting tourism, these include; EALASCA Games, World Future Cities Exhibition, Miss Tourism Central Region Cluster, Tourism Excellence Awards by the Uganda Tourism Board.

KCCA in partnership with Kinetic trust in facility development where the partners are developing architectural designs for sports facility development in Kisaasi Primary school; KCCA in partnership with Stadia for Africa for facility development at Nakasero and Kitante Primary schools

KCCA Primary schools athletics competitions were held where the team reached the National Athletics championships finishing 8th overall out of over 65 districts while The KCCA Special needs team/deaf won silver at the national championships.

Participated in several sports and game events in primary schools and motivational issues. These include: zonal athletics competitions and Authority competitions for primary Schools; basketball 2014 championship party to recognise the team; followed up sports activities in schools and KCCA Sports clubs; Prepared procurements for primary schools sports and Clubs (uniforms, water, meals) and.

KCCA staff Participated several sports events including; Kabaka's run(40 staff), the MTN Marathon, the Corporate League with 45 teams competing in several disciplines and games; the Uganda cup; Kampala International Beach soccer event 2015; Kampala International 7's rugby Championships 2015; Kampala to host IAAF World Cross Country Championships 2017; the rotary, cancer run, Bible Society race, Corporate League with 45 teams competing in several disciplines and the inter directorate staff tournament which kicked off with KCCA Managers Vs supervisor's.

Organised a community sports event including; inter arcade competitions; Primary Schools Athletics with support from City tyres and Kikuubo traders Sports gala with Kikuubo traders; the KCCA Interdivision Youth Sports Tournament and the Youth Group's Forum celebrations with Save the Children Initiative

Organised the EALASCA games for 2014 where Kampala City won the overall championship and hosted several related events including; hand over of chain of offices, Ministerial conference and opening and closing ceremony. Held the first general meeting for the EALASCA Committee to review and Prepare for 2015 EALASCA in Rwanda.

KCCA clubs have participated in several events. Their performance is as follows; KCCA FC is in third place in Uganda Premier League table standings in March and still playing to win the Uganda Cup; KCCA Netball Club finished in 4th in the East African Netball Championships held in Dar es salaam in March and KCCA Athletics team participated in the Jinja National Championships and MUKtrials where the team qualified.

Other sports and games events participated in are KCCA Basketball Club won the National Basketball League title 2014; KCCA Netball Club finished in 5th Position out of 11teams in the Uganda National League and KCCA Athletics team participated in the MTN Marathon where they finished as fifth

KCCA participated in the National league 2014 and was among the top three teams of the league.
