However implementation of activities to achieve the above outputs was not as fast as anticipated; thus affecting the Vote budget performance; largely due to the following reasons:

- •Insufficient budgetary releases; MAAIF only received 21% of the approved budget in 1st quarter instead of the projected 31%. This implementation of some of the planned activities.
- •The activities to fast track the procurements (contractual obligations) that were rolled over from FY 2013/14 were delayed by the revalidation of procurements requirements under the PPDA.
- •The open bidding procurement method regulation continues to delay the contracting of firms for most of the capital development procurements involving huge sums of money.

MAAIF intends to find solutions to overcome the above constraining issues so as to improve the Vote budget performance in the 2nd quarter of FY 2015/16; and in the rest of the FinancialYear.
