- -By close of Quarter MEACA had received UGX 35.395 of funds representing 72.7% of funds of the approved annual Budget.
- -of the UGX 35.395Bn, UGX 643M was meant for Staff salaries, UGX 25.045 WAS Non wage, UGX 425M was development funding and UGX 9.282Bn was funds meant for Pension Arrears payments.

- 3. Development Funds: The under expenditure is mainly as a result of delayed conclusion of the procurement processes for acquisition of Motor Vehicles.
- 4. Pension Arrears: Verification and validation of the old pensions still on going.

Variances and Challenges

- -Out of the released funds of UGX 35.395 only UGX 23.549Bn was spent out translating into a 66.5% cumulative budget expenditure performance and 48% spent of the entire approved Budget.
