Variances and Challenges

The Ministry's budget performance by end of the Financial Year stood at 105.4%, this was due to the supplementary budget allocations of Ugx. 1.051Billion to cater for Person to holder emoluments for the two Ambassadors (Amb. James William Kinobe and Amb. John Crysistom Alintuma Nsambu) and the retooling project funds amounting to Ugx.0.488Billion.

The budget expenditure performance stood at 102.2% and this over performance is attributed to the wage and retooling which performed at 116% and 117.7% respectively due to the two supplementary allocations.

The release expenditure performance was 97.0%, the under absorption was mainly due to the low absorption of external funds, gratuity and delayed initiation of procurement requests by departments mainly for ICT equipment and stationery.

Challenges

- i. The Ministry is heavily underfunded.
- ii. Inadequate staffing in the area of economic and commercial diplomacy and legal services.
- iii. Difficulty in implementation of bilateral MoUs.
- iv. Lack of incentives to attract the diaspora to invest in Uganda.
- v. Slow response from other MDA's which negatively impacts on our output.
- vi. Accumulated arrears to contributions to international organizations which may hinder the Ministry and the country from benefits associated with these organizations.
- vii. Increased human trafficking activities by Ugandans that could taint the image of the country.
- viii. Unstable / tabulate region. (Fragile situation in DRC, Burundi, South Sudan and Somalia.
- ix. Increasing and persistent Tariff and Non-Tariff Barriers.
