Challenges in budget execution

- 1. Change of release procedures from Legacy to IFMS led to delays in release of funds away from the target of funds.
- 2. Under MSC, the zones of Hoima, Jinja, Kabarole, Masaka, Mbale, Mbarara, Moroto and Soroti were not able to balance their collections with disbursements, hence reduction in their outstanding portfolio.
- 3. Under the FINMAP project some activities were delayed due to late disbursements from the development partners. Some activities such as the development of the management information system is under procurement.
- 4. Low disbursements of loans in the aforementioned zones are majorly attributed to delayed submission of documents by clients but also to the limited credit funds at MSC.
- 5. Insufficient funds released impacted on the activities to be implemented and as a result some activities were differed to quarter three.
