Performance highlights for the Quarter

COFFEE EXPORT PERFORMANCE

During Q3 FY2022/23, a total of 1.461(60kg) million bags valued at USD 196,554,952 were exported compared to 1.330(60kg) million bags valued at USD 215,360,626 of the same period previous FY2021/22 representing an increase in export by 7.6% & a decrease in value by 8.7%. The lower exports were due to biannual off-year Arabica production & drought coupled with incidences of pests & diseases i.e. BCTB & Red blister. COFFEE PRODUCTION ESTIMATE

The Authority carried out a coffee production survey in 7 districts of Western & gross coffee production from the region was estimated at 0.926(60kg) million bags on account of severe drought.

Variances and Challenges

i) Coffee Production & productivity challenge;

• There are increased incidences of Black coffee twig borer (BCTB) & Red blister disease in Eastern, Western, Rwenzori, Central & Northern. In some areas of Western, Coffee wilt disease is again devastating coffee plantations. However, farmers were advised to intensify sanitation to eliminate weeds in the gardens, embrace communal approaches towards management of prevalent pests and diseases and as a last resort, spray their coffee with Imidachloprid and Tebuconazole to control BCTB.

• Coffee production was recorded lower than the same period last year majorly due to drought and off seasonality for Arabica coffee.

ii) Demand for coffee planting materials;

• There is still overwhelming demand for coffee plantlets particularly in Mar–May 2023 planting season. There is however no budget for planting material at UCDA since Government of Uganda changed strategy of providing coffee seedlings to farmers through the Parish Development Model.

iii) Natural disasters;

• Heavy floods were experienced in Elgon & Rwenzori, which greatly affected coffee farmers & their farms. This resulted in loss of crops including coffee.

iv) Limited funds disbursements;

• The current economic situation compelled Government to re-prioritize & cut down expenditure & less funds were released which greatly affected implementation of field operations hence productivity.

v) Coffee Quality, Value Addition & market Promotion challenges;

- The quality of coffee is still affected with defects for instance the Robusta (Busoga) had high percentage of chalky whites and discolored beans.
- Shortage of containers is presenting a logistical challenge for export business of coffee in regards to coffee movement.

• Increased coffee adulteration.

• Limited space of Lugogo laboratories to handle increased export samples.
