Quarter 4

Performance highlights for the Quarter

COFFEE EXPORT PERFORMANCE

During Q4 FY2022/23, a total of 1.390 (60kg) million bags worth USD 223,641,079 were exported compared to 1.392(60kg) million bags valued at USD 227,555,760 of the same period previous FY2021/22. representing a decrease in export by 0.2% and in value by 1.7%. The lower exports were due to biannual off-year Arabica production, the Sudan civil war & drought coupled with incidences of pests & diseases i.e. BCTB, Red blister and coffee wilt. Cumulatively, during FY22/23; 5,761,229(60kg) bags worth USD 845,938,612 were exported.

COFFEE PRODUCTION ESTIMATE

The Authority conducted a coffee production survey in which gross projections of the main crop were 3.2 million bags of clean coffee in SouthWest and 1.13 million bags in Greater Masaka

- Inspected 1,390,963(60kg) bags for export
- Promoted coffee consumption at 21 local events
- Promoted Uganda Specialty & Fine coffee at 3 international exhibitions

Variances and Challenges

i) Coffee Production & productivity challenges;

There are increased incidences of Black coffee twig borer (BCTB) & Red blister disease in Robusta growing areas and Coffee leaf rust and coffee berry disease in Arabica growing areas. However, farmers were advised to intensify sanitation to eliminate weeds in the gardens, embrace communal approaches towards management of prevalent pests and diseases and as a last resort, spray their coffee with Imidachloprid and Tebuconazole to control BCTB and Leaf rust.

Coffee production was recorded lower than the same period last year majorly due to drought and off seasonality for Arabica coffee.

ii) Limited funds disbursements;

The current economic situation compelled government to re-prioritize & cut down expenditure hence less funds were released which greatly affected implementation of field operations causing low productivity.

iii) Coffee Quality & market Promotion challenges;

There was an Increase in the reported cases of coffee adulteration and shortage of containers presenting a logistical challenge for export business of coffee in regards to coffee movement.
