Performance highlights for the Quarter

- Participated in the 41st Ordinary Session of the Executive Council & the 4th Mid-Year Coordination Meeting in Lusaka, Zambia on 14-16 July; and 17 July 2022 respectively; and the 44th Ordinary Session of the Permanent Representatives' Committee (PRC) held from 20 June to 08 July 2022.
- The Executive Council recalling decision EX.CL/Dec.1143(XL) on the debt owed to Uganda, directed the AU Commission to effect the total payment of USD12,194,333.40 for Contingent Owned Equipment by August 2022.
- Participated in the 8th Summit and Senior Officials' Meetings of the Tokyo International Conference on Africa's Development (TICAD 8) in Tunis, Tunisia from 27-28 August 2022 where Japan announced investment of USD30 billion over the next 3 years to promote public and private investment and US\$4 billion to promote green growth; made a new commitment of up to USD 1.08 billion over three years for the 7th Replenishment period of the Global Fund for achieving Universal Health Coverage to support measures for countering HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria; indicated a recent decision to contribute USD130 million in food assistance to African countries and USD300 million to bolster food production through co-financing with the AfDB and assist with capacity building for 200,000 people in the agriculture sector; and the 5th phase of the Enhanced Private Sector Assistance for Africa (EPSA5), a joint resource mobilization initiative between AfDB and Japan was initiated to provide co-financing of up to USD 5 billion;
- Ms. Caroline Nalwanga Magambo, from Uganda, was endorsed for re-election as a Member of the UN Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions for the period 2024-2026.
- Held a meeting with Sante Medical College, a private Medical College based in Addis Ababa. The College is interested in partnering with Medical bodies in Uganda for student exchanges, work affiliations and a programme for exchange of medical practitioners.

- Limited Human and Financial resources to deliver on the Mission's mandate
- Deplorable living conditions for the Head of Mission and state of the chancery
- Uncertainty caused by changing policies of the Ethiopian Government
- Inadequate budget allocation particularly on travel abroad which makes it difficult for the mission to participate in meetings and activities where there is no sponsorship is provided by the organisers
- Delays in implementation of commitments and preparation of country reports
- Delays in remittances distort the missions plans vs activities
- Non-attendance by MDAs in key AU meetings
