- ) Limited Human Resource to fully deliver on the Mission's Mandate
- 2) High cost of living in the capital Addis Ababa since its a diplomatic hub. Embassy staff suffer the wrath of this situation despite numerous appeals to consider grading Addis Ababa Mission to class A
- 3) Loss on poundage affecting the Mission's budget.
- 4) Both Political and Fiscal Uncertainties in Ethiopian Government. For example the currency devaluation that led to high inflation of the Ethiopian Birr
- 5) Limited coordination and inadequate sharing of information between the Mission and the respective government MDAs.
- 6) Delayed responses to correspondence from the Mission on issues such as confirmation of Uganda's participation in meetings, composition of delegations, guidance on Uganda's positions in meetings and on different matters e.g. candidatures
- 7) Non attendance by MDAs in key meetings
- 8) Clashes in scheduling of activities and meetings which often results in non-participation by the Mission and/or the relevant MDA
- 9) Late communication by the different organization's e.g. on scheduling and invitations for meeting
- 10) Inadequate budget allocation particularly on travel abroad which makes it difficult for the Mission to participate in meetings and activities where no sponsorship is provided by the organizer's
- 11) Delays in implementation of commitments for example annual subscription to the AU membership requirements and preparation of country reports.
