#### Performance highlights for the Quarter

Coordinated the following development assistance from the Government of Japan: -USD 6m grant from the Government of Japan to Uganda for the refurbishment of Jinja and Soroti Regional Referral Hospitals -Contribution of 2,000 metric tons of rice worth JPY 300 million (USD 2.2 million) from the Government of Japan through the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) in Uganda. The contribution will enable WFP to provide hot meals to 50,000 newly arriving refugees in 2024/2025

Coordinated inquiries by NAHF Connects, a Japanese coffee importing company, to be introduced to competent and trustworthy coffee producers/suppliers in Uganda to start importing coffee beans from Uganda and distribute it through its behemoth network of customers.

Held a meeting with the President of International Women's Coffee Alliance (IWCA), an organization which supports female farmers. Efforts are underway to link IWCA with Ugandan female farmers.

Attended the Consultative Meeting for the 2024 Korea-Africa Summit where the following key issues were discussed:

- A Business Summit will be held on 5th June 2024

- Side events will take place before, during and after the Summit in the following areas of cooperation: business, climate change, transport, infrastructure, tourism, education, ICT, among others.

Coordinated the planned visit to Uganda of Mr. Masakuni Ukita, the Chief Executive Officer of Remedy & Company Corporation (formerly called Intellim Corporation), a Japanese clinical research organization and his five-man team to engage with the Ministry of Health of Uganda on the possibility of establishing a joint venture with Infectious Diseases Institute to increase clinical trial capabilities on infectious, non-communicable and oncology diseases in Uganda.

Coordinated the planned visit of AC Planta to commission their crop heat resistance product called "Skeepon", aimed at boosting organic agricultural productivity in Uganda. (After the product had been tested and approved)

#### Variances and Challenges

1. Limited Funding for Diplomatic Activities: Insufficient funding has hindered the Mission's ability to engage in Commercial and Economic Diplomacy activities in Japan and South Korea (ranked 3rd and 13th respectively, as the world's largest economies). The Mission was not able to participate in 2 major exhibitions in Japan held annually- Specialty Coffee Association Japan (SCAJ) World Specialty Coffee Conference Exhibition and the Tourism Expo Japan

High Rental Expenses: The Mission incurs significant rental expenses, exceeding 30 percent of its budget, due to the absence of owned property.
 Lack of Capital Development Funding: Over the past four years, the Mission has not received any capital development funding, leading to the deterioration of its assets.

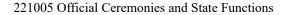
