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#### Performance highlights for the Quarter

On August 25, 2024, Uganda's Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, Hon. Henry Oryem Okello, met with JICA's Senior Vice President, Mr. Naoki Ando, to discuss infrastructure projects, including the Kampala Flyover, Kampala Metropolitan Transmission, Atari Irrigation, and Karuma Bridge. JICA emphasized Uganda's need for timely funding and land acquisition, with additional guidance on securing Japan Bank for International Cooperation support for road maintenance.

Uganda highlighted its tourism potential at the Tourism Expo Japan (TEJ) 2024, held from September 26-29. Representatives from the Buganda Kingdom, BIC Tours, and Uganda's Mission in Tokyo promoted the nation's cultural and natural attractions. The Buganda Kingdom emphasized the Kasubi Tombs, a UNESCO World Heritage site, while Kaori Yamabashi of Gorilla Highland Coffee showcased Uganda's Arabica coffee from Kisoro Highlands.

#### Key outcomes included:

- Partnership discussions with ITA Airways' Benedetto Mencaroni Poiani to enhance connectivity with African airlines. He expressed interest in Uganda's natural sites, planning a gorilla trek with BIC Tours.
- Strong interest in gorilla trekking, leading to extensive inquiries and material distribution.
- An invitation for two Ugandan children from Heart and Earth, a Japanese NGO, to join the "3rd Five Continents' Festival" at the 2025 World Expo in Osaka
- Farouk Busuulwa of Adventure Vacation Safaris delivered a skills presentation on sustainable tourism for Uganda.

#### Variances and Challenges

- 1. Limited Funding for Diplomatic Activities: Insufficient funding has hindered the Mission's ability to engage in Economic and Commercial Diplomacy activities in Japan and South Korea (ranked 4th and 14th respectively, as the world's largest economies in 2024). The Mission was not able to participate in 2 major exhibitions in Japan held annually- Specialty Coffee Association Japan (SCAJ) World Specialty Coffee Conference Exhibition and the Tourism Expo Japan.
- 2. High Rental Expenses: The Mission incurs significant rental expenses, exceeding 30 percent of its budget, due to the absence of owned property.
- 3. Lack of Capital Development Funding: Over the past five years, the Mission has not received any capital development funding, leading to the deterioration of its assets.
