- 2. Coordinated activities of the Uganda export promotion board (UEPB) at the 2023 Doha horticultural expo.
- 3. Attended the grand African festival in Doha by the proprietors of Grand malls in Doha and agreed to increase the volumes of Ugandan products in their malls. The Embassy has contacted UEPB to identify a reliable supplier.
- 4. Coordinated activities of MS Kon Group of Qatar and Kanaha Holdings in Uganda for establishment of a meat rendering plant in Uganda as well as promotion of Uganda in the Gulf as a tourist destination.
- 5. Engaged with the Director African Affairs and agreed to sign the Pending labour MOU on the 1st of April, 2024.
- 6. Issued 122 Letter of Residence to Ugandans in Qatar to facilitate their renewal of passports.
- 7. Issued 34 Certificates of Identity to Ugandans lacking valid documents to enable them travel to Uganda.
- 8. Attested 128 documents submitted to the Embassy.
- 9. Issued 50 Emergency Travel Letters to Ugandans due for deportation but lacked valid Travel Documents.
- 10. The Mission accommodated 9 female distressed Ugandans. These lacked accommodation, food and other necessities for which the Mission provided.
- 11. Coordinated the Repatriation of 02 bodies of Ugandan female and male.
- 12. The mission coordinated the compensation of work benefits of one Ugandan who died while on vacation in January 2024.
- 13. Made 10 consular visits to Ugandans in Jail, 15 visits to deportation camps, 8 visits to accommodation facilities and 01 visit to the court to translate for a one Ugandan lady who was convicted.
- 14. Made 12 visits to the ministry of labor to follow up and also help in the filing of cases of Ugandans who had issues with their companies and sponsors.

### Variances and Challenges

The Mission has and continues to face the following challenges:

1. Lack of adequate and sound vehicles and frequent breakdown of the available utility vehicle hinders carrying out implementation of Mission activities.

- 2. Increased number of Ugandans trafficked to Qatar, mainly maids, after being promised other job categories.
- 3. Increase in the number of Ugandans at the deportation center who lack valid travel documents and are unable to pay for the certificates of identity, leading to their delayed deportation.
- 4. A number of distressed Ugandans, especially females come to the Mission looking for accommodation, food, and other unique necessities. However, the Mission is no adequately resourced to offer these specific needs.
- 5. Inadequate budget provision to facilitate implementation of the core activities of the Mission such as the Commercial and Economic Diplomacy promotion activities.
- 6. Absence of halal certified slaughterhouse in Uganda hindering the export of meat products to Qatar
- 7. Staffing gaps including the position of Translator. This hinders the Mission's ability to deliver on its mandate.
