Variances and Challenges

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- 1) Harsh working conditions; The air pollution levels in India are the highest in the world, posing a serious health threat to people living and working in the country. In a December 2023 publication (available on their website) the World Bank stated that "All of India's 1.4 billion people are exposed to unhealthy levels of ambient PM 2.5 the most harmful pollutant emanating from multiple sources. These small particulates with a diameter of less than 2.5 microns, is about one-thirtieth the width of a human hair. Exposure to PM 2.5 can cause such deadly illnesses as lung cancer, stroke, and heart disease. 1.67 million deaths were attributable to air pollution in India in 2019, accounting for 17.8% of the total deaths in the country."

 It is by no surprise therefore, that Medanta Hospital, the High Commission's health service provider recommends the use of air purifiers in every room of one's residence and office. This interim remedy however, does not safeguard Mission staff while they are in the field. We therefore, advocate that the High Commission be granted special permission to pay hardship allowance.
- 2)Lack of funding to support repatriation of victims of Human trafficking; Ugandan women rescued from their traffickers have to be temporarily sheltered, fed and medicated. Further to this, they must pay an overstay fee of 50,000 rupees (approx. 2,500,000 UGX) and facilitate them to go back home.
- 3)Slow responses from Headquarters: And by HQs I mean the relevant MDAs put together.
- 4)Lack of online verification mechanism for documents; the High Commission is routinely required to verify passport details, medical referral documents, marriage certificates, certificates of good conduct, among others, which is impossible to do without a real-time online link to the issuing entity.
